Applicants must be 16 – 24 years old, a legal United States resident, economically disadvantaged, and/or have a documented disability

Job Corps Eligibility Requirements

Age Requirements

16 -- **24** years of age. A student cannot apply for Job Corps until they are 16 and must arrive on center *before* they turn 25. A student may turn 25 or 26 *after* they are a student on center. Any student under the age of 18 must have parent or legal guardian consent to enroll.

Income Requirements

Economically disadvantaged. A student's individual and/or family income must fall below federal poverty income guidelines which are based on family size. The individual must also be a legal United States resident

Additional criteria that may qualify a student for Job Corps (regardless of their income):

- *Any type of a *documented* disability--learning, physical, or mental--may qualify a student for Job Corps
- *An individual who receives cash welfare payments, government medical assistance, or food stamps
- *A foster child for whom state or local government payments are made or a ward of the state

Behavior

Drug and alcohol free at time of admission. Applicants will be tested on center to show their ability to remain drug free during enrollment. Students must be free of all behavioral problems that would prevent them or others from successfully participating in Job Corps. **Students cannot interview with any open court cases or outstanding fines, restitution, or community service.** Other issues regarding a student's behavior record that are considered during the application process include:

- 1. Current and past face-to-face supervision with a social worker or probation/parole office;
 - *face-to-face supervision must be *completed* before a student is eligible for Job Corps
 - *misdemeanor or felony convictions may require a 1-3 year wait before eligible for Job Corps
- 2. Participation in alcohol and other drug treatment programs, anger management, or counseling
- 3. Any periods of incarceration or jail time
- 4. A student's inability to adjust to the standards of conduct, discipline, and training that is required

Child Care

Adequate child care arrangements must be made for applicants with dependents. There is only one center in this region that has child care arrangements for a student to bring their child to Job Corps and it may take 4-6 months to enroll. Students cannot enroll in Job Corps if they are more than 12 weeks pregnant.

Attitude

Job Corps is a voluntary program and a student cannot be forced to attend! Applicants must attend class daily, follow all program rules and expectations, be respectful toward Job Corps staff, and be interested in establishing a career or future for themselves.

Steps for Job Corps Enrollment

- \rightarrow Educate yourself on the Job Corps program. Read this entire packet of information, log onto the internet at http://jobcorps.doleta.gov, and/or tour a Job Corps center. Tours are available at Blackwell weekdays 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. so call 715-674-2311 today and arrange to have lunch on center!
- \rightarrow Complete the enclosed pre-application and mail or fax it to the Job Corps office in Green Bay (see address and fax number above). The interested student must complete the pre-application..... not a parent or relative! Once I have received the pre-application, you will be contacted to discuss your eligibility for Job Corps and scheduled for an orientation.
- \rightarrow Call to schedule an orientation at a nearby job center. Please see the office locations below and keep in mind that I cover 19 counties in Wisconsin and try to manage them as efficiently as possible.
- \rightarrow Request a one hour interview with an Admissions Counselor after you have attended an orientation. An interview is required for enrollment into Job Corps. Students *cannot* interview without completing the **enrollment requirements** listed on the reverse side. Do not hesitate to contact me with any questions.
- \rightarrow Additional documents may be requested following the scheduled interview. Once the application is complete, the student's application will be sent to the center for review. Depending on center choice and trade preferences, acceptance into Job Corps can take anywhere from 4 - 12 weeks.
- Job Corps departs students each and every Tuesday. Students will be notified by their admissions \rightarrow counselor once they're accepted into the program so that transportation arrangements can be made.

Orientations be held at the various locations listed below and are approximately $1 - 1 \frac{1}{2}$ hours in length. If interested in attending, please call (920) 435-1543 to be scheduled for an orientation. All students will be asked to send in a completed pre-application prior to being scheduled for an orientation or appointment.

Enrollment Requirements

- *a copy of your *signed* social security card (visit www.socialsecurity.gov/ or call 800-772-1213)
- *a copy of your birth certificate (certified original is required for driver's education; www.dhfs.state.wi.us/VitalRecords/)
- *a copy of immunization records (shots such as your MMR, tetanus, etc....school may have)
- *a copy of your health insurance (if covered)
- *a copy of a driver's license or photo ID (a picture ID from school would work)
- *high school transcripts (most recent high school, alternative school, or home-school records)
- *income verification: a tax return, W-2's, or two paycheck stubs (family income if under 18)
- *an essay explaining your interest in Job Corps
- *(5) emergency contacts including their current address and phone number
- *receipts or proof of completion for any fines, restitution, and/or community service hours
- *2 or 3 letters of recommendation (from non-family members)
- *employment history (including employer addresses, phone numbers, and dates of employment)
- *high school information form (form will be provided after pre-application is received if under 18)
- *a copy of your diploma, G.E.D., or H.S.E.D
- *a copy of your most recent Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or M-Team Report
- *recommendation from social worker/probation agent if ever on supervision (form provided)
- *child care arrangements including child's birth certificate, social security card, & shot records

<u>Medical Records:</u> If hospitalized within the last four years or under a doctor's care for any medical or mental health reason (asthma, counseling, or medications for example), please obtain the records or a discharge summary from your doctor prior to your interview if possible. They will be required for your application to ensure you receive adequate medical care while in the program.

<u>Court History</u>: Interviews cannot be conducted with pending court dates. All fines and restitution must be paid and community service hours completed prior to scheduling an interview. *No exceptions!* A court record (including traffic violations) is conducted on every applicant. An existing record does not automatically mean a student is ineligible, but it will be considered in the application process.

<u>Upper Peninsula of Michigan:</u> Michigan residents have the option to meet with a Michigan Admissions Counselor if they cannot travel to Wisconsin for an orientation. The Michigan centers are listed below:
